## *February 12, 2013 Regular Monthly Meeting*

The DelVal Turners hosted this year's first Micro Symposium during February's regular meeting at the Moorestown Friends shop. There were 49 members in attendance at the opening of the meeting, but at least 5 or 6 additional folks came in as the meeting progressed. During the New Business portion of the meeting, members were reminded of the evening's agenda: five sessions being delivered simultaneously:

- Don Hart demonstrating sharpening
- Joe Quigley demonstrating chip carving
- Marty Richter showing multi-axis spindle turning
- Steve Leichner demonstrating kitchen utensil handle fabrication
- Phil Hauser demonstrating wood burning technique

☞ In other new business, members were asked to contact President Hauser or Marty Richter if they had a skill or craft that could be demonstrated in a one-on-one setting and could be included as a package in the upcoming Moorestown Friends School Fund Raising Auction.

☞ Jeff Kieserman gave a short talk on the content available through the DelValTurners.com website and spoke about access to the Members Section. There is lots of content there and members are always encouraged to utilize its contents and please contact Jeff Kieserman if you have more to contribute.

☞ The HOW or **H**ands **O**n **W**orkshops are currently being planned and members willing to give lessons are encouraged to contact Seth Chamberlain to give a description of the program they wish to offer, in addition to dates and times. These HOW sessions are a major fundraiser for the club and help all members expand their skills and experiences. A list of sessions will be announced in the coming weeks, with most of these opportunities being offered in April and May.

☞ A woodburner construction session is planned for this Spring based on equipment demonstrated at Graeme Priddle's past workshop at the DelVal Turners. Members interested in building the units are asked to contact Phil Hauser and Marty Richter. *Phil will be securing the NAPA battery chargers to power the units and Marty will construct the hand pieces. The units will run \$90, payable in advance. A second option will be to use a less expensive battery charger available through Harbor Freight (\$65)—contact Phil and Marty if this is a route you prefer. Construction of these units is set for Saturday, March 9, 2012 at Phil's Hainesport, NJ workshop. Please contact Phil and Marty by the 7<sup>th</sup>, however, so that materials will be available for you on the 9<sup>th</sup>.*

☞ Mark Allan is coordinating a bulk purchase of AnchorSeal II for DelVal members, a waterbased treatment used to seal green wood and greatly reduce checking during seasoning of turning stock. Members are able to purchase the liquid in 5-gallon units. From Mark:

Six club members have committed to purchasing a five gallon quantity of Anchorseal. That leaves five openings for those with similar intent. When I have ten paid buyers, I'll order the drum for delivery to my shop and will arrange a "pumping party" for the partners in this purchase. Delivery from Buffalo by common freight should take 3 to 5 days.

You can purchase five gallons for \$55, not including a container. If you want less than five gallons, please partner with another member or maybe someone from Bucks or First State. The next 5 paid buyers finish the deal and move us to the delivery phase. A check for \$55 can be sent to me at 25 Lancaster Drive, Marlton, NJ 08053.

A "Homer" bucket works just fine, but a 5 gallon Carboy with spigot is the ideal vessel, I think. The Anchorseal is a winterized formula and will flow well through the Carboy spigot, even after sitting on a shelf for a year (from my own experience). A Carboy is a plastic container, often used for water (and for brewing beer)...available at REI, some Army/Navy stores and camping outfitters for about \$17, or as little as \$12 online...try Amazon, ULINE, US Plastic, or Lab Depot. One good brand is Reliant Aquatainer, but there are others, too. As all containers are not equal, I'll use an indexed 5 gallon bucket to make sure you get what you've paid for and that we have enough to go around to all the buyers.
